


Call for Speakers

About the Event

The Nebraska Brain Injury Conference, hosted annually by the Brain Injury Association of Nebraska, brings together professionals and individuals affected by brain injury to facilitate connections and learning within the community. The 2026 conference will take place at the Younes Conference Center (South) in Kearney, Nebraska, on March 19 and 20, 2026, spanning approximately a day and a half from Thursday to Friday.

What We'll Need from You:

Speaker Information

- · Contact Information (Name, Organization, Job Title, Phone Number, Email, etc.)
- Social Media Handles (for advertising/promotional purposes)
- · Whether you are presenting on behalf of your organization or as an individual
- · Resume or Curriculum Vitae
- Brief Bio of Yourself (3 -5 sentences)
- · Co-presenters and how to reach them
- · Video links to previous presentations (if possible)
- · Considerations/requirements on your end (fees, contracts, accommodations, etc.)

Presentation Information

- Presentation Type (workshop/practical demonstration, panel discussion, standard presentation)
- · Presentation Title
- Primary Content Theme/Area(s)
- Brief Presentation Description/Abstract (no more than 2 paragraphs)
- Intended Audience/Experience Level
- Key Objectives/Takeaways (minimum of three)
- · Information about what materials, if any, will/can be shared with the audience
- Technology/setup needs
- · Whether you have published anything on this topic or presented it at other events

Final Considerations

We request that presentations aim to be accessible to a general audience, accommodating both professionals and individuals affected by brain injury or their caregivers attending many of the sessions.

- -Please propose innovative ideas and approaches that challenge conventional thinking on longstanding issues or current trends in the topic areas. Presentations focusing on specific products are better suited for exhibitor booths.
- -Our ideal speaker collaborates with us to enhance the attendee experience. Please note that we operate on a small non-profit budget with limited funds for speaker fees.

Selection Process

Submissions will undergo review by Brain Injury Association of Nebraska staff and a committee composed of professionals and prior conference attendees, including individuals and caregivers, in August and September. Notifications regarding acceptance or regrets will be sent by

November 2025.
